Scammers are increasingly targeting older adults with schemes that exploit trust and financial security. Here we'll detail specific schemes and how you can help protect yourself and your loved ones...

When 65-year-old Betty Smith joined an online dating site "Silver Singles", she was looking for love—but instead fell victim to a scam. "Jerry" gained her trust and convinced her to send over \$500,000 for fake investments and personal emergencies in what's known as a *pig butchering* scam, a growing fraud targeting older adults that caused \$2.3 billion in losses last year.

Protect yourself from these scams:

- Don't respond to unknown texts or messages.
- Be cautious on dating sites and social media.
- Never send money or gifts to someone you've never met in person.
- Avoid sending gift cards or using cryptocurrency machines for payments.
- Keep personal info private.
- If someone online asks for money, pause and talk to a trusted friend or family member.
- Stop all communication and contact your bank immediately if you suspect a scam.
